### Habitat and Ecology

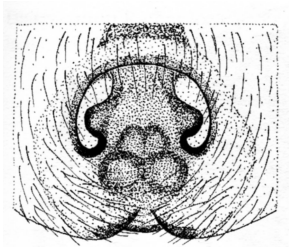
In Europe *Dendryphantès rudis* is found on the branches and trunks of trees, especially conifers.

### Status

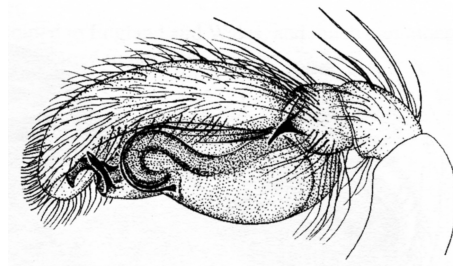
There is only a single British record for this species. It was recorded in 2016 on the branches of non-native pine trees in Liverpool. It is uncertain that the species has successfully established in Britain.
